The death, injury, or loss of said reptile due to theft, carelessness, recklessness, abuse, neglect, accident, or other medical condition will not entitle the adopter to any compensation from SRRFC. There are no guarantees or warranties stated or implied with regards to the adopted reptile. No warranty is given to the adopter for any special purpose or function of this reptile. This reptile is not to be used for any illegal or immoral activities and is not to be used for any type of reptile farm or other mass producing or money making operation. In the event the adopter is unable to keep this reptile for any reason, the Adopter agrees to offer to SRRFC the first chance to take this reptile back. In the event of a re-sale the Adopter must notify SRRFC with the new name and address of the new adopter and it must be approved by us first. Adopter agrees not to sell this reptile to any retail company or establishment. This reptile is adopted to you as a pet only and nothing further.
